



Fran is 15!

Quinceañera Facts (Background Information)

It began in Latin America, traditionally in Mexico and Puerto Rico. It is becoming very popular in the United States.

A Quinceañera usually takes place after a Catholic Mass.

Every birthday girl chooses a special outfit to wear that shows her personality.

There is dancing, food, drinks, gifts, a big cake, and music at the party.

There is a traditional father-daughter dance to celebrate the importance of family and the relationship between the birthday girl and her father.

A Quinceañera can last for several hours or all day and into the night.
