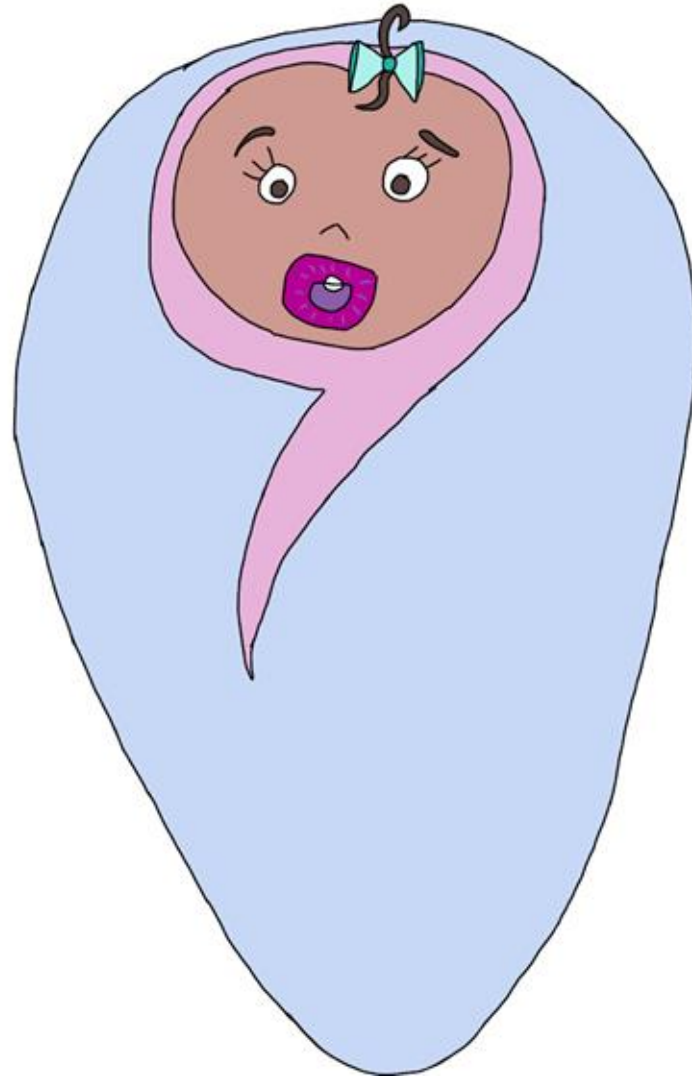


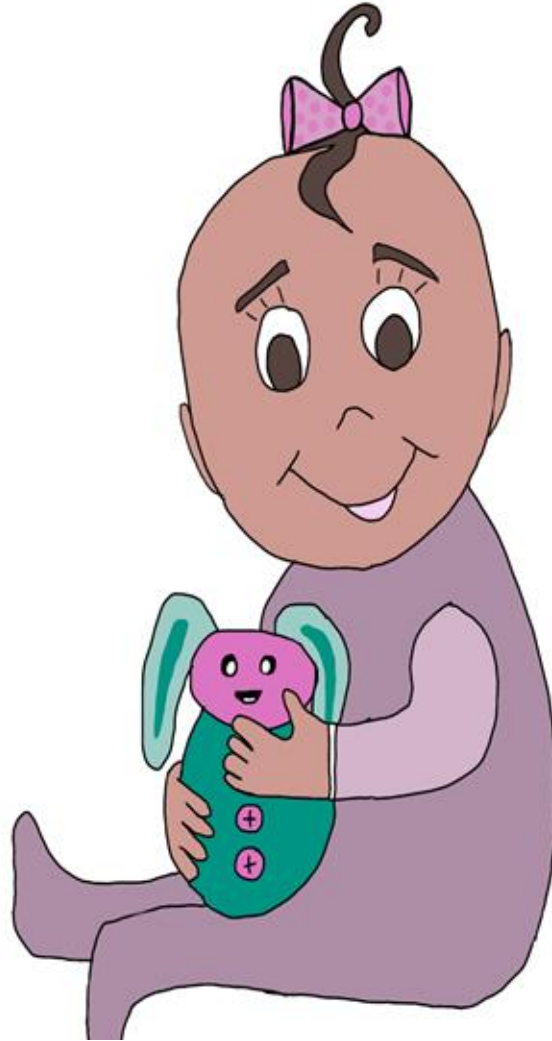
My Sweet Pea



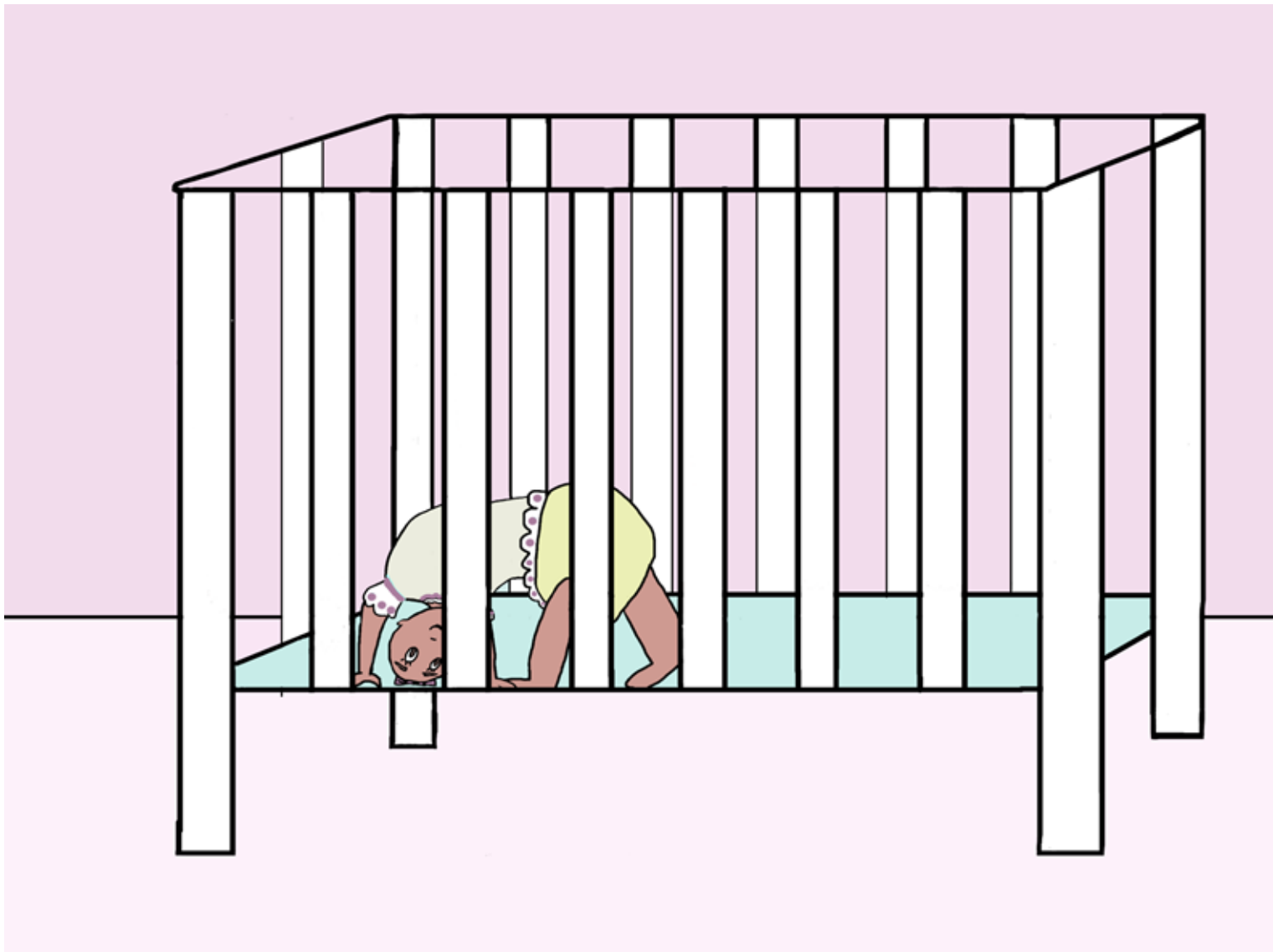

My niece Bree is a baby.



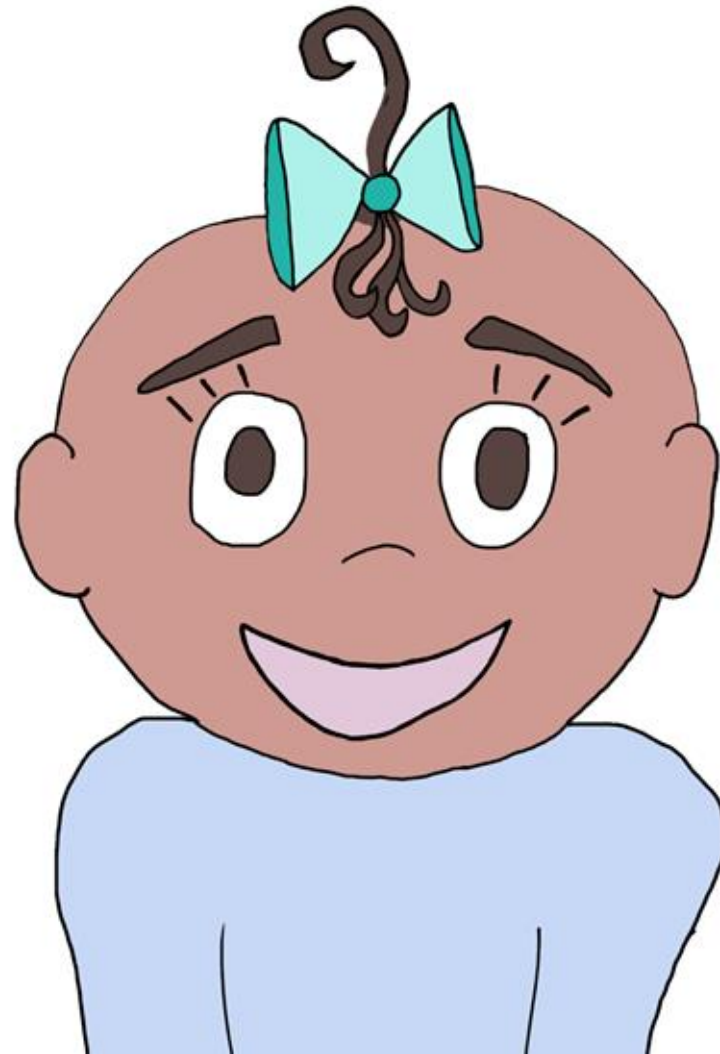
Bree is sweet. She does not cry.



But she does not sleep.



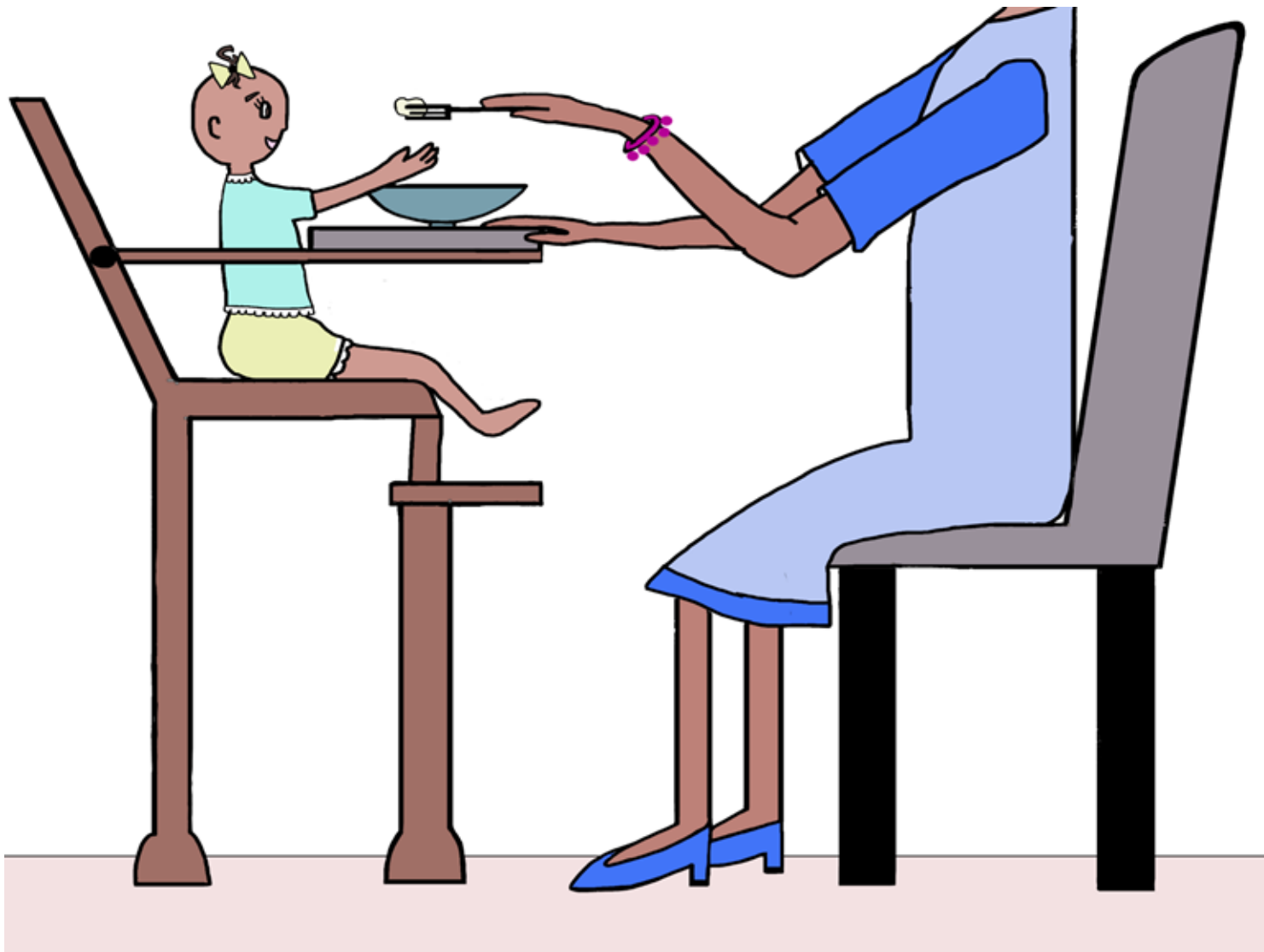
Bree does not speak much.
