There were a bunch of torn spots and spills on the quilt but Steph didn't mind at all. She felt the quilt was good luck so she kept it in the back of her truck.




Steph and her dog Frank went on a quest to find a gift for Grams.

Steph had a sniff and a long whiff. The plant had a fresh crisp smell.


The plant cost six bucks. Steph spent all her cash on the plant but she was thrilled with the grand gift for Grams.
